Word from the Pastor

God rest ye merry, gentlemen, Let nothing you dismay. Remember, Christ, our Saviour was born on Christmas day...

Those are the opening words of the Christmas carol, God Rest Ye Merry Gentlemen. This carol was written in the 15th century, Old English. It wasn't published until the 19th century. It is reported to be one of the earliest and most popular of the carols. It is no wonder that this carol was chosen by Charles Dickens as the one sung by the carolers in his classic story, A Christmas Carol.

I grew up with this Dickens tale. It captured me first with its ghosts and suspense. I think I have watched just about every movie version made and have my favorite Scrooge portrayals. Now as an adult I read the story and watch the movies with a different eye. This is a story of brokenness and redemption. Could there be a more unrepentant literary figure than Old Scrooge?

This year I have been reading a book by Matt Rawle, <u>The Redemption of Scrooge:</u> <u>Connecting Christ and Culture.</u> The author makes a connection between the story of Ebenezer Scrooge and the story that we as Christians tell during Advent and Christmas. Each of the ghosts bring to Scrooge some important truths about his past and present and future realities that parallel the traditional Advent themes of peace and hope and love and joy! Since the connection has been made in Rev. Rawle's book, I decided to use it as a theme for our Advent worship this year.

Christmas has always been my most favorite time of year. I love the traditions and the music and the multitude of activities and events. My own family traditions always centered around 2 things: church and Sweden. Growing up in a Swedish American family we were blessed with wonderful foods and stories, Lucia, tomten and family gathering. Christmas in our house did not begin when the Macy's Santa came into view. Our observances of Christmas began when Santa Lucia came on the morning of December 13th, the date of the Winter Solstice in the old Julian calendar. I learned early that you had to wait for Christmas!

This year, as an adult, I look beyond the magical stories of Christmas miracles and see the birth of Christ in a different light. God sent Jesus into the world as a Savior. It was the beginning of the story of redemption. In their magic and miracles, the stories that we read and tell are stories of redemption and transformation. Something miraculous takes place when animals talk and shepherd boys bring their lambs to the baby in the manger.

We participate every year in the story when we gather gifts and food for those who





"As problems and roadblocks mount, as faith seems unproductive, as doors slam we find it easy to think about quitting our personal faith race". How does the book of Hebrews help us today, to keep on the track and run with perseverance on the path God has put before us?
