Word from the Pastor

Dear Members & Friends,

Chinese New Year's Day falls on February 14th this year. I can assure you that on that day you will find me and others of my family sharing a meal with my mother at a Chinese restaurant. The meal will include chicken, beef, pork, and seafood. Superstitious people believe that if you don't eat a little of each on New Year's Day, you will find imbalance in your life during the year. By giving out cash gifts to everyone on that day, you are wishing that each person will also receive sufficient material wealth in the new year. And often you'll wear something new on New Year's Day. The Chinese have many other traditions around their New Year, such as not eating any food in the new year that was prepared in the prior year, in hopes that the New Year will bring with it a new beginning.

This year, Ash Wednesday follows just a few days later. A mere coincidence, but a fitting one. Ash Wednesday marks the opening of the period of Lent, which is the forty days (when you take out the Sundays) before Easter. Throughout the centuries, Christians have used this period of time to reflect on their faith in Christ as Lord and Savior, so that Easter Day might have a new meaning and mark a symbolic new beginning in the Christian's life.

Human beings seem fixated on "new beginnings" in their lives. It is an acknowledgement of the fact that while each of us strives to be the best and always do the right thing, we are human and we make mistakes. We don't always follow through with things as we hoped. There are always things that are left undone. Things plain just don't work out the way they should. The Good News is that each of us has the opportunity for a "new beginning" at any time of year, not just when an old year ends and a new one begins. We do not have to wait for Easter or for Christmas. The celebration of Easter, along with the 40 days of Lent preceding it, are reminders that God has given us the opportunity to start anew each time we feel burdened by mistakes we have made, dead ends we have encountered, and roadblocks found along the road of life. Easter is all about a new beginning anytime we need one.

So during the upcoming Lenten season, I hope you will not only reflect on our faith and the sacrifice Christ made for all humanity, but also on the fact that because of God's love for us, we can a "new beginning" whenever we need it. As often as I mess things up in my life, it is the greatest blessing I have ever received!
