#### Word from the Pastor

#### COWS HAVE MEETINGS AND THEN GO TO LUNCH....

**Summer Greetings!** 

I'm writing to you from 34,000 feet above the Great Plains as I head to San Francisco. Yesterday evening, at 9:40 pm, Alexander Wu Ryu was born. He's the first decent chance the Wu family has to make it into the NFL: 8 lbs 14 oz, and 21 ¾ inches long. When his mom was born back in the late 70's, it was inconceivable that a grandparent who lives on the other opposite side of the country could, upon hearing that his daughter was in labor, make arrangements to greet the grandchild within 18 hours of his birth. The world has changed. And much of the change that takes place in our world is a product of three things: God's grace; a solid understanding of the world in which we live; AND a bit of dreaming and imagination.

The true reason I need to see our first grandchild immediately is to indoctrinate him in my world view as quickly as possible. You see, Christina has pledged to NOT teach her children something that I taught her in her earliest days of childhood....that cows have meetings and then go to lunch. As you all realize, I'm a city slicker. Honestly, I did not see a real, live cow until an elementary school trip to the Easton Diary Farm in third grade. Prior to that time, the only cow I knew was named Elsie, and she was on the side of Borden milk cartons. But when Christina was young, I promised that my children would not be deprived of nature the way I was.

So I shared with Christina my fascination for cows and other animals. We traveled by car regularly to visit relatives in the Midwest, and we'd see our share of cows out in the fields. During rest breaks, I'd carry her into fields so we could get a close look at them. Christina soon noticed that at certain times of the day, the cows would all follow each other in a nice line. She was a very inquisitive child, and asked me what the cows were doing. Not having the opportunity to "commune with nature," I had no idea why they were walking together like that. But as her father, I felt that I owed her an answer. So I told her that the cows were going to a meeting. Shortly thereafter, she noticed that the cows in a field were all eating out of a stainless steel feed bin. And she asked what they were doing. So I told her, "After their meeting, they have lunch."

From that time on, whenever we saw cows walking in a line, Christina would enthusiastically say, "The cows are going to a meeting!" And whenever she saw cows eating, she'd say, "The cows are having lunch!" That all fit in very well into my personal, imaginary world that I shared with Christina, where animals (even stuffed ones) talk and have the ability to reason the way we do. But as children grow older, society discourages them from living in their imaginary world. One day someone must have popped the bubble of our shared, imaginary world and told Christina that cows don't have meetings, and they don't go to lunch. And she felt a bit silly about her heartfelt belief and reliance on her dad's representation that cows, like humans, have meetings and lunches. And so she pledged never to teach her children that silly, imaginary fact.

While cows having meetings and lunch probably didn't have a prominent role in making our nation great, faith, a solid grounding in reality, and a good dose of dreaming did. The same is true for the ministry of our church. All of our ministries began with visions, dreams and imagination. Children's Discovery Center, the Boar's Head Festival, the Mexico Mission Trips, and so many things we now see as the "norm" were probably seen by many as beyond our reach when first imagined. The same is true for many of the future dreams we have for our Church. But with faith and a good understanding of the realities of the world in which we live, we have made what was previously fantasy a reality.

So no matter what everyone says, I'm going to teach Alexander that it's OK to fanaticize and imagine that cows have meetings and then go to lunch.


