Bon jour!

Greetings from Montreal. I am with 17 others from First Church for the weekend and on our first day here we toured the outer edges of the city (and some adjoining islands) by bicycle. We went over 25 miles, and although it may sound like an easy task on a bicycle, I assure you that everyone is exhausted!

How a trip to Montreal for our youth fits into our Christian ministry is a very valid question. In less than 24 hours, we have witnessed God's love as manifested through many of the Canadians we have met. As we crossed the border into Canada, the immigration official overlooked the fact that I forgot leave the parental consent forms in the vehicles in which each teenager was traveling and took them all with me in the first vehicle through the border. This morning, while at Atwater Market along the Lachine Canal, a gentleman in a motorized wheelchair stopped to ask where we were from, what we were doing in Montreal, and left wishing us a wonderful stay. We were reminded by their actions that it doesn't matter what race or nationality we are...we all have the ability to touch others' lives in positive ways.

Along the Lachine Canal, we saw many buildings that looked like the factory buildings in Winsted. We pointed out that industrial and economic development are often tied to God's gifts to us such as abundant water and rivers. From another perspective, spending this concentrated time together has been an excellent learning experience for everyone, including the adults!

For generations, a key ministry of First Church has been giving its children and youth experiences that create a sound foundation for the future. Those experiences include education, working on outreach and ministry together, and learning that together through Christ we are able to do far more than we ever imagined. This trip fits squarely into the ministry of the Church!




