### Children's Discovery Center News

CDC has been awarded another generous grant from The Libby Holman Foundation. This grant will pay half of the yearly tuition for 4 children to attend our preschool program. The grant requirements are:

- 1.) The children applying must attend our 3 day a week program (MWF 9-1:00)
- 2.) Children must be 3 years of age by December 31, 2015
- 3.) The child must be a NEW student to the preschool (meaning not currently or previously enrolled)

The yearly tuition cost is \$2,500. With this grant, families will only pay \$1,250.00 (which is broken down into 9 monthly installments).

If you are interested in applying for this grant, please complete an enrollment application. Applications can be found on our website or you may call the school (860) 379-4838. All applications must be received by June 20th! There is a \$25 application fee when applying. If you choose not to accept the grant or do not receive the grant, the fee will be refunded. If you have any questions, please call us.



### **Pursuit of Happiness!**

500 people were attending a seminar. Suddenly the speaker stopped and decided to do a group activity. He started giving each person a balloon. Each person was then asked to write their name on it using a marker pen. Then all the balloons were collected and put in another room.

The people were then let into that room and asked to find the balloon which had their name written on it within 5 minutes. Everyone was frantically searching for their name, colliding with each other, pushing around others and there was utter

At the end of 5 minutes no one could find their own balloon.

Then, the speaker asked each person to randomly collect a balloon and give it to the person whose name was written on it. Within minutes everyone had their own

The speaker then began, "This is happening in our lives. Everyone is frantically looking for happiness all around, not knowing where it is.

Our happiness lies in the happiness of other people. Give them their happiness; you will get your own happiness. And this is the purpose of human life...the pursuit of happiness."



Ben E King (Benjamin Earl Nelson), singer and songwriter, born 28 September 1938; died 30 April 2015. Born in Henderson, North Carolina, and moved to New York with his family at the age of nine, part of the migration of black workers from the southern states to the more prosperous cities of the industrialized north. As a teenager in Harlem, where he helped out in his father's three restaurants, he sang in church choirs but also joined his school friends in a street-corner vocal group, the Four Bs, imitating the harmonies they heard in recordings by such doo-wop heroes as the Cadillacs, the Five Satins, the Charms, the Moonglows, and Little Anthony and the Imperials. His unusual vocal flexibility, spanning the range from bass to tenor, enabled him to sing virtually all the lead and harmony parts. Most known for his work with the Drifters and his single, "Stand by Me" which went to #1 on the R&B charts and #4 on the Pop Charts!

### This Year's Mexico Mission Trip

On July 9<sup>th</sup>, a delegation from First Church will once again depart for Oaxaca, Mexico. Our Church has been sending groups to Mexico for over 7 years, and we've done just about everything imaginable. Among other things, we've built houses, replaced roofs on buildings, repaired and maintained vehicles, replaced electrical systems, painted, cleaned, and most importantly, spent time with the children living at the Casa Hogar children's home.

Unlike some groups that prefer to do the same thing each year, we seem to enjoy doing different things. This year's "to-do list" will include our first ever visit to the Casa Hogar satellite facility in the town of Cuicatlan. It is located northeast of the city of Oaxaca (toward Mexico City), and it is a nearly four hour ride away from the Oaxaca facility. The town is at a lower altitude than Oaxaca, so it is hotter and more humid there.

The Casa Hogar in Cuicatlan was originally a one family house. The director of that facility donated his home so that it could be used as a facility for children in the surrounding villages whose families did not have the financial resources to feed and educate them. About 25 children live in that facility, along with 4 adults who care for them. Originally the house had only one bathroom for the boys, one bathroom for the girls and a small kitchen that would be typical in a Mexican home. In the past year, mission teams have built two more bathrooms for the children and also added a new kitchen.

The First Church team will begin their week in Oaxaca where we will work with our favorite construction materials: cinderblock and concrete. We will be helping to complete the final touches on the retaining wall which replaced the one that was collapsing after some neighbors who do not want the children's home there placed truckloads of fill against the outer side of the wall with the intention of collapsing it. Their plan worked, but they probably didn't anticipate that our Church would fund a new wall to keep the children safe...

The team will then head to Cuicatlan to paint the bedrooms of the children. We'll also host a movie night for the children (bringing our own DVDs and projector), and repair their pick-up truck. The pick-up truck is over 15 years old, and hasn't run for over 3 months. The last time it had significant work was a few years ago it was brought to Oaxaca City and First Church teens enabled the engine to produce enough power to climb hills again. It is their only vehicle, so it is critical that we get it running again.

This year's delegation includes Brigitte Smyth, Mike Artruc, Alex Artuc, Frank Artruc, Laura McCaw, Debby Kane and Mike. Jessica Wu and Tino Gaspar, who live in Oaxaca, will join the group for the entire time, as will some other Mexican friends who are interested assisting in our mission efforts.
