## A Word from Pastor Kap

"Blessed is the nation whose God Is the LORD..." Psalm 33-12



Our nation stands within the bookends of Memorial Day Independence Day, as we celebrate the 243<sup>rd</sup> anniversary of our Independence from Britain. #### Parking Lot Repaying

Our driveway and parking lot have become a safety issue. There are sunken areas and drainage issues that could prove to be potential areas of liability, considering the amount of usage it gets.

We are currently taking bids for this repair which is expected to run approximately \$30,000. The good news is, we already have \$13,000 towards it including \$6,000 in our invested funds slated for capital improvements and a bequest from the Estate of Dorothy Newbauer in the amount of \$7,000.

The Cabinet is requesting to earmark an amount not to exceed \$20.000 from our Invested Funds to complete this project which includes the balance of the proposal plus an additional \$3,000 as a buffer in case of overruns. Any donations towards this project would also be greatly appreciated if you are able to give!

This will be announced from the pulpit and included in our bulletins and on Sunday, June 16 there will be a presentation, discussion and a vote of the congregation to approve this project.

Please plan on sticking around after the service for this important vote!

# First Church 2019 Mexico Mission Trip!

This summer we are again headed to the Yucatan peninsula of Mexico to work at "SolyLuna" (which means the sun and the moon). This organization operates schools in two different locations in Merida, the capital of the State of Merida. The schools not only provide an education to its students, but the organization provides outpatient physical therapy to children with multiple, significant physical disabilities. The program was founded by a European woman who was visiting that region of Mexico. She was struck by the lack of services of disabled children, especially those from families with minimal financial resources. She had a brother with multiple disabilities, and fully understood the challenges faced by both the disabled person and his/her family, even when living in a country with sophisticated medical facilities and a good network of social services.

She quickly discovered that there were few, if any, resources available to disabled children in this region of Mexico. Students in her program were given little chance of survival by their own doctors. Seeing such enormous challenges, she has since dedicated her life to serving those children. She has a small but very dedicated group of supporters in Europe and in Mexico. Many of the therapists that provide physical therapy and classes are volunteers. The parents of the children receive training at the schools on caring for their disabled children, and they themselves work at the school. We are proud to be a part of that small network of volunteers who assist at the organization. Because of the work of SolyLuna, children who were diagnosed to live but a few years have learned to walk, feed themselves. read and write.

We're excited not only because we are returning to Merida, but because our team will include 5 people who are participating for the first time! Another 5 on the team are "veterans" of First Church Mission Trips. Our tasks this year include the installation of a wi-fi network in both facilities that will allow teachers to use computers that are connected to the internet in all the classrooms; installation of another security camera for the

facilities (we installed 2 last year after a break-in that took place the night after we departed); painting the kitchen of the youth facility; building large planter boxes for the students in the youth program to learn to plant and care for vegetable plants; repairing screens; and building a storage shed at the children's facility and a tool shed at the youth facility. Because of the intense heat and humidity, our team works in the morning, retreats during the hottest part of the day, and returns in the evenings to work until 9 or 10 o'clock at night.

You can assist by making a contribution to the First Church of Winsted Mexico Mission Trip Fund. In addition to paying for our travel, lodging and food, we also pay for all the materials that we use in our projects. While each participant contributes what s/he is able, the majority of the costs for the Mission trip are covered by generous donations. On December 4, 2000, the United Nations General Assembly decided that June 17 would be celebrated as World Refugee Day in Resolution 55/76. The date was later changed to June 20.
