An opportunity to serve First Church of Winsted

Church Clerk - Looking for a church member who is interested in serving as one of the five officers of the Church and to be an active member of the Church Cabinet (consisting of the officers of the Church, the chairs of each Board, and the denominational representatives). The ideal person for this position would enjoy sharing their thoughts and opinions and would have an organizational knack. The Clerk, among other things, is responsible for keeping the Church's records on its membership and takes the minutes of both Cabinet meetings and meetings of the Congregation.

The Clerk is a voting member of the Church Cabinet and attends all Cabinet meetings (which currently are on the fourth Tuesday of each month along with occasional special meetings). S/he also attends meetings of the Congregation (including the Annual Meeting in January). The Clerk keeps the record (minutes) of the Cabinet meetings and the meetings of the Congregation. The Clerk also maintains the Church's files of official documents and records (such as letters of transfer, etc.); in coordination with the Diaconate maintains the list of the members (with dates of their reception, death, transfer, or dismissal); provides a report on membership information from the prior year at the Annual Meeting; completes statistical data questionnaires from the United Church of Christ and the American Baptist Churches each year; and will utilize ICON, the church management software program, to record membership information and statistics.

United Church of Christ Denominational Representative - First Church of Winsted is affiliated with both the United Church of Christ (UCC or Congregational Church) and the American Baptist Churches. Each of those denominations allows for every member church to designate a voting member to represent the local congregation in the denomination. The ideal person for this position would have an interest in expanding our Church's relationship with the UCC and other Congregational Churches, and would be comfortable sharing information about First Church with other Congregational Churches in Connecticut and in sharing information about the ministry, mission work and activities of the UCC with members of First Church.

The UCC representative is also a voting member of the Church Cabinet and attends all Cabinet meetings. S/He also attends meetings of the Litchfield North Association of the United Church of Christ (usually twice a year) and attends the annual meeting of the Connecticut Conference of the United Church of Christ.

First Church Mexico Mission Trip

For the 9th year in a row, We will be traveling with a group of youth and adults from First Church of Winsted to Oaxaca, Mexico. This is a life altering trip both for the youth in our church and the children at Casa Hogar. Not only are we helping others down there but it make a profound change to the kids that come from our area of the world. It helps them expand their horizons and experience life outside of the small town they grew up in. The kids we have taken down with us have said that it changed their life plans and they have become better people because of what they have experienced.

This year, the group will spend a week at Casa Hogar Benito Juarez, home to more than 60 children whose parents are unable or unwilling to raise them, most of them have either physical or emotional handicaps. The home is located in Oaxaca City and is operated by Carol and Francisco Marin. Casa Hogar means, "Not only a house but a home." It raises children as a family, providing everything that a child needs to develop physically, mentally, and spiritually.

Casa Hogar has no age maximums and is one of the only children's homes in the entire state that accepts children with disabilities. The home provides an education to each resident at all levels. Many have gone onto college and earned professional degrees.

Last year, our team re-wired two thirds of the electrical system wiring at Casa Hogar. We found 25 year old wiring thatwere charred and burnt in many places due to overloads and short circuits. When we asked some of the children why they never told anyone that you get shocked every time you touched the light pole at one end of the soccer court, they replied that everyone knows not to touch it, especially when it rains. The electrical work required us to remove the pavers and trench in many places to lay new electrical cables. We also replaced the leaky metal roofs on two of the older classroom buildings on the grounds of Casa Hogar, stained the flooring outside the three new classrooms, and didmaintenance on all of the vehicles owned by the home. The children of the home assisted us in all of the work. Even those with severe disabilities enjoyed painting or digging.

This summer's activities will include re-wiring the remaining electrical circuits in their buildings, installing a new waterheater to replace both a broken one and an old technology, and replacing the retaining wall in the back of the complex that is collapsing and which has been a significant safety hazard to the children. Because of the critical importance of the retaining wall, we will hire a "maestro" (expert) to help us do the work properly.

Although the facilities are always in need of maintenance and repair, the most important activity will be spending time with the children of the home. With only five resident adults (three of whom are wheelchair-bound), the children need attention and love. We will host the annual birthday party for all the children (providing gifts of clothes to each), provide a live mariachi band, and serve them their favorite dinner (pizza from Sam's Club).

We will be traveling down on July 12th this year. You can assist by making a contribution to the First Church of Winsted, Mexico Mission Trip Fund or by sponsoring a walker on our annual Walk-A-Thon around Highland Lake on June 21, 2014. Chris George, Executive Director of Integrated Refugee and Immigrant Services (IRIS) in New Haven will speak at the UCC in Cornwall on Sunday, June 8th at 11:30 a.m. about the work of IRIS in re-settling refugees in Connecticut.

The talk will be at our Paris House, and all are invited!

The mission of IRIS is to enable refugees to establish new lives, regain hope, and contribute to the vitality of their new communities. The organization works to provide housing, jobs, education, language classes, health and wellness programs, and legal services for refugees and other displaced people, mainly during the first year after their arrival in Connecticut.

Current refugee clients are from Afghanistan, Iraq, Iran, Sudan, Congo, and other countries.

IRIS also educates communities about the refugee experience and issues of national and international importance to us all.

The Parish House is directly in back of the church, at 8 Bolton Hill Road, just off Route 4 in Cornwall Village. We look forward to welcoming you.

But their delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law they meditate day and night.


Psalms Chapter 3
