Word from the Pastor

Dear Members and Friends,

It's seems hard to believe, but Spring is finally hear. Not only are we enjoying more sunlight, but we haven't had a day with temperatures below freezing for a while!

We had a fun guessing game going on for the last few weeks. Everyone was invited to guess the day on which the huge snow pile on the side yard of the church building would be totally gone. There were a good number of guesses. And let me first say that my guesses (yes, I submitted multiple) were totally off. It turns out that the last bit of snow disappeared from the side yard on Thursday, April 23rd.

No one guessed the exact day that the snow would be gone. The closest guess was May 1st, submitted by Katherine Stover. The closest guess without passing the day (what I call the "Price Is Right" theory of winning) was April 12, submitted by Mel Lee. Congratulations to both Katherine and Mel! The vast majority of guesses were mid-May and beyond. Whether it was because of the heavy rains or some other reason, God surprised us with the speed by which the snow melted!

Last Sunday (April 19th), there was an informational meeting for the congregation. The leadership of the Church shared information about the upcoming transition in pastoral leadership. One of the messages shared was that God surprised us in that process also. Nearly two and a half years ago, I asked the Church Cabinet to begin a process of continuous evaluation of the pastoral needs of the congregation. It was evident that the objectives in the covenant we entered into at the beginning of my tenure were nearly all fulfilled. So we had regular discussion to better understand who we are as the First Church of Winsted, what factors contribute to making our ministries vibrant and effective, and how our growth was impacting the then present model of pastoral and lay leadership in the Church.

One of the findings from our studies was that we needed help in moving from a smaller congregation to a medium sized congregation. We recognized that we need to communicate in new ways instead of assuming that everyone knows what is going on. We grappled with our varied individual styles of leadership, and the changes in society that affect the way our members and friends are able to participate in the life of the Church. We also met with a potential consultant about helping us transition from a small to medium sized congregation.

That's when God surprised us. The discussions about consulting evolved into discussions about pastoral leadership. The members of the Church Cabinet, over the course of four or five meetings with the potential consultant, discerned that God might be calling the person to act not as a consultant, but as a transitional pastor for our congregation.

We were not able to share specific details until now because the candidate is pastoring another congregation and hadn't yet discussed with them the possibility of leaving that

pastorate. But a few weeks ago, the candidate decided that God was calling her to leave her current position to work with us and she so advised her current congregation.

For that reason, on May 10 (yes, Mothers' Day), the Rev. Lisabeth (Lisa) Gustafson will be preaching and leading our morning worship service. Immediately following the service, there will be a special meeting of the congregation to act on the recommendation of the Church Cabinet that Rev. Gustafson be called as our next pastor.

The entire process has unfolded in a unique way.

Normally, the existing pastor has no part in helping a church discern what attributes and gifts that they should seek in the next pastor. The more common course is for pastors to just "give their notice" out of the blue. The leadership hustles to find temporary pulpit supply while others begin the search for an interim pastor. Both first-hand experience in our recent past and studies show that changes in pastoral leadership cause a church to stand still or slip backwards in an amount equal to two years of growth and progress. From the time I raised the matter of new pastoral leadership with the Cabinet, it has been our stated purpose to follow God's will rather than our personal preferences, and to have whatever change God has in store for us take place with a minimum of trauma or disruption to the ministry of First Church.

While I did not participate in any of the substantive conversations between Rev. Gustafson and the Church leadership that led to the Cabinet's unanimous decision to present her to the congregation as a candidate, I was made aware of the progress being made so that I could plan to assist in the change of leadership. Rev. Gustafson and I have agreed to overlap our work with First Church. Trusting that there will be a positive vote on May 10th, we will be working together the entire month of June. I have utmost confidence in Rev. Gustafson's ability to hear my perspectives and views, and at the same time filter them with her professional objectivity. She will bring to the congregation a fresh, new perspective that is grounded in some background and assistance from the current pastor to speed her assimilation into the life and ministry of First Church.

Rev. Gustafson is an experienced pastor with many gifts and talents. It is interesting how our lives intersected in various ways yet how we are unique and distinct in others. She is a graduate of Clark University in Worcester, Massachusetts. I was a student at Clark

for the first three years of my undergraduate studies, and two of my brothers graduated from Clark. She received her Master of Divinity degree from Colgate Rochester Divinity School in upstate New York. Among her many gifts, she is a multimedia artist, prayer shawl knitter, avid hiker, plays the guitar, sings, gardens, and enjoys reading. She is also a certified K-8 teacher, and has served as a Minister of Christian Education, Senior Pastor, and since 2008, the Transitional Pastor at Bristol Baptist Church in Bristol, CT. Like myself, over the course of her professional career, she has also held secular positions. Rev. Gustafson is very active in the life of the American Baptist Churches of Connecticut, as am I.

As will be explained at the special meeting on May 10th, Rev. Gustafson will be initially called for a period of two years. She possesses great confidence in God's wisdom and will, and has agreed that after her first year, she will jointly with the Church Cabinet assess her ability to continue to facilitate the growth of First Church's mission and ministry. It will be mutually decided at that time whether she will continue as pastor beyond the second year or whether she will use her second year with us to assist the leadership in finding more suitable pastoral leadership.

Over my fifteen years as a member of the First Church family (including ten years as Pastor), I have come to consider each of you as family. The decision to pass the baton to Rev. Gustafson is not because of any breakdown in our relationship. It is because of the opportunities that God has set before First Church. When I accepted the call to be the Pastor of First Church, I agreed to always do what is in the best interests of God's ministry at First Church, not what was easy or comfortable for me. In my heart I sincerely believe that the Church I love so dearly will grow further and continue to flourish with new pastoral leadership.


