The 5th Voice

THE pastor was gone one Sunday, and our local high-school music teacher preached. He spoke about "the fifth voice," an idea I had never heard of. He drew the concept from the singing of barbershop quartets. "The fifth voice" refers to the one harmony created by the four voices as they join together in song. The

unified sound becomes like a fifth voice.

Just as a group of singers can be more than each of them is alone, Christians living in love create something more than they could on their own. The day before Jesus was crucified, he told his disciples that the world would know that they were his followers by the way they related to one another, that they were to cherish and care for one another.

First Corinthians 13 describes the characteristics of this Christian love. Paul exhorted the Corinthians to be patient and kind, to turn aside from jealousy, boastfulness, pride, rudeness, selfishness, and irritability. Love forgives and lets go of hurts and offenses of the past. When Christians live together in love, the world hears a voice it needs to hear: the fifth voice that reveals the presence of the Savior.

What is BUNCO?

It is a dice game played in pairs. The object is to score 21 points. It is played in 6 rounds. The first round you try to roll ones (you have 3 dice.) For every dice rolled a one you get a point and you keep going. If you roll 3 ones you get BUNCO!! A Bunco roll is worth 21 points. If you roll 3 of another number you get a BINCO. You get one point for every one roll and your turn is over when you roll the dice and no ones come up. The round is over when the head table scores 21 points first. The next round you try to roll 2s and on to the 6th round. At the end of the round you total up your points and the winning team moves to the next table. The losing team stays. You switch partners when you get to the next table. All players are given tickets they place in cups for BUNCO winnings, BINCO winnings, winners of the round and losers of the round. If you get BUNCO you have

to yell BUNCO and the Bunco Ball is thrown to you to hold until the next BUNCO winner.

At the end of the game we draw names for prizes. We first select from the BUNCO, then the BINCO and then Winners and finally Losers.

If we collect enough prizes (and we should) everyone will go home with a prize.

It's easy, everyone catches on quickly and we will have plenty of veterans to the game to be placed at tables. I hope you can come and bring lots of friends. It's a fun, new way to raise some money for our Youth Mission Trip. \$15 gets you food, fun and a likely prize. HOW CAN YOU BEAT THAT!!
