Word from the Pastor

Lenten Greetings!

As you may know, Lent consists of the 40 days (plus Sundays) before Easter. It is a time when we reflect on the sacrifice made by Christ so that we could live free from guilt about our errors and wrongdoings. It is a time to prepare for Easter, the central and most important Christian day of the year. In many traditions, people make sacrifices such as not eating meat on Fridays. Churches often have special Lenten Bible Studies to reflect on the death and resurrection of Christ.

The truth of the matter is that there is no one "correct" way to prepare for Easter. The objective is to step back from the hustle of our busy lives and to reflect on the life and ministry of Christ, and most importantly, the love God showed to us by allowing Jesus to give his life for the forgiveness of our mistakes. As silly as it may sound, it's sometimes hard to admit our humanity and to acknowledge that we are not perfect. But it's easier to admit our mistakes knowing that we are forgiven. May God's love shine in your lives during this Lenten Season.

I'm guessing; I'll never know.




COFFEE HOUR INSTRUCTIONS...
