Word from the Pastor

Greetings in the name of Christ!

With the seemingly unending winter weather, it is hard to believe that the Lenten Season is upon us. What is Lent? It is the 40 day period (not including Sundays) from Ash Wednesday to Easter Day. Because the Easter event is the focal point of our Christian faith, it has been a tradition for centuries to use those 40 days of Lent to prepare oneself for Easter Day.

From my childhood days, I remember Lent as the time when we were required to give up something that we really liked. It was often candy, dessert, or something like that. The purpose was to help us better understand the sacrifice that Christ made for all of us. Coming to a better understanding of Christ's sacrifice for us is very important. But we can do that in many different ways and we should not limit ourselves to giving up something we like for the 40 day period of Lent. In fact, to best prepare for Easter, I think it is important to do different things to round out our understanding of the importance of the event.

While I welcome you to give something up, I want to encourage you to also do something different during this year's Lenten season. Christ gave his life so that we would all be freed from the bondage of sin. That bondage is often manifested by guilt, anger, and the inability to do what God really wants us to do. So to more fully understand the meaning of Christ's crucifixion, I ask you to consider forgiving someone who has done something that continues to this day to bother you. I can almost guarantee you that this will be much more difficult that not eating candy or dessert for 40 days. But even if we cannot successfully let go and forgive someone for something that happened in the past, the attempt to do so will help us better understand the meaning of Easter.

As you will read in this edition of the Bellringer, there is a lot going on in the life of our congregation. One of the most important activities of our Church is to care for one another. During this busy time of year, I also ask that you pick up the phone once in a while and check in on another member of the congregation. The stronger we are as a church family, the better we will be able to do God's work in our community and around the world.

2014 Mexico Mission Trip

For the eighth consecutive year, First Church will be sponsoring a mission trip to Oaxaca, Mexico. Our work over the years has been varied and challenging: the mission trip participants built homes at the local dump for families that collect plastic bottles for a living, distributed food to thousands of needy people in the mountains, and last year did major infrastructure repairs at the Casa Hogar children's home. Those repairs included replacing roofs on the classroom buildings, rewiring the electrical system of two thirds of the facility, and of course, spending time with the nearly 70 residents of the home. This year we will again be returning to Casa Hogar, and once again, our mission team will include both members of our congregation and friends from Saltillo, Mexico (a city over a thousand miles north of Oaxaca). If you are interested in being a member of the mission trip team, please contact Pastor Mike for more information. Even if you can't travel to Mexico to work with the team, there will be many opportunities for you to be part of the endeavor and support this year's team.


Hey do you feel the rhythm?
