Word from the Pastor

Lenten Greetings,

The objective of most Lenten traditions and observations is to strengthen our relationship with God by learning something new about ourselves.

I'm writing this message in England. Michelle, our youngest, is spending a week here in Oxford as part of one of her courses during the final semester of her graduate studies. We were last together here over 10 years ago, when she spent a semester abroad on the southern coast of England. I flew across the Atlantic to get her settled for the five month stay. We spent two or three days shopping for everything she needed for her stay. I drove and walked her around the City of Brighton so that she would be familiar with her new surroundings. When we parted, I felt comfortable that my mission, preparing her for the lengthy stay at a new school in a foreign country, was accomplished.

Ten years later I find myself doing the same, except that in my heart I knew that she didn't need me to bring her to Oxford. She could have easily gotten here on her own. But I needed to make the trip with her so that I myself could comfortable that she would be fine! As the day went by, I realized that things changed dramatically since our last visit together to England. Michelle knew exactly what train we needed to take from London to Oxford. She led me through the train stations to find the correct trains. Even though she had not been to Oxford before, she knew exactly how to get from the train station to the hotel where her class would be based. When I suggested we walk up a certain observation tower overlooking the city, she told me that there was another tower a block away where the admission price was half of what was being charged where we were. At the end of the day, she took me back to the train station using a short cut she had figured out during our walk through the city.

What did I learn about myself through this experience? Although I still cling to the illusion that my children need me, it was Michelle who guided us through our excursion to a new city.

Sometimes we live in the past when God is calling us to the future. Often, there is a time when the job we were called to do has been completed but we would prefer to be in our past role. During this Lenten season, I hope that we all can come to accept that God often calls us to move forward when we'd rather live in the past.



Muddy Boots Praise Choir was started in 2014 by Dan Jones. The choir sings songs of Christian Renewal...! Great way to begin the Spring season of Steam Vent.



The Alternates Duo is a two-piece rock band from Southington Connecticut that performs and records original music and covers. The band is composed of Julian Sherwood (drums, vocals, djembe) and Zack Skarzynski (electric/acoustic guitar, vocals). They perform at bars, competitions, coffee houses, and other events with a full drum set and electric guitar. However, they also have a full acoustic set, which includes acoustic versions of their latest originals and acoustic covers. Some of the artists that influence them and make it into their set lists are The Beatles, Buddy Holly, Jack White, and The Ramones. Their sound, while refined and unique, is remnant of old Beatles music with a delivery that kicks like The White Stripes. Their youthful vigor and energetic performances make them a fun band to see no matter where they are.



Eric Paradine Eric Paradine is a Connecticut singer songwriter who has been writing and performing in the New England area for the last 10 years. His appearances are marked by top notch musicianship and singing that has given him the reputation of being a player's player. 
Clarification/Correction!!
