

Word from the Pastor



At a recent meeting of ABCCONN folks, we were talking about the changing face of our churches and our associations. The ways we have related to one another have become outdated and we need to renew...refresh and revitalize our connections. It was a very lively discussion and lots of ideas were shared and dissected. couldn't stop thinking about First Church and the hunger for renewal we all feel.

Then one of my colleagues shared something he had learned about lichen. Believe me, it got our attention. What does lichen have to do with relationships in the church?

First, I need to tell you a little about lichen that I learned last week. Lichen is an ancient life form. When you see a lichen growing on a rock or tree, it looks like a single organism. But it is actually a symbiotic relationship (a close and long-lasting association between two or more organisms). The basic two organisms are algae and fungus. The essential nature of each part remains intact. Each one must be fully themselves or the lichen won't last. For the whole to flourish, the individuals bring their unique characteristics.

So, in church life, think about how this translates. The words of Paul to the church at Corinth come immediately into my mind.

¹² For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. 13 For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and all were made to drink of one Spirit. 1 Corinthians 12: 12-13



We Rock – by Emily King

I've stood in many college hallways in recent months. Waiting.

Waiting for a tour guide.

Waiting for the unlocking of a dorm room, a lab, a classroom.

Waiting for my child's name to be called.

Waiting for an intended major or program to be shared. Waiting for our turn to meet the dean, the advisor, the director.

Waiting with other parents, their teenagers often taller than they, but sharing noses, hair color, brow-lines, hall space...

There is something I've begun looking for on every tour in these waiting times and I've become simultaneously comforted, amused, and saddened by the surety with which I find it.

The fathers typically stand against the walls. Their upper backs leaning, their comfortable loafers or worn sneakers jutted just slightly forward. Sometimes they briefly check their cell phone before self- consciously and quickly tucking into a breast pocket. Their faces are mostly open and amused, but sometimes bored and distracted. Often their arms are crossed comfortably, heads tilted, just waiting.

But, the mothers...

The mothers. And this is what simultaneously makes me a little sad, makes me smile to myself, and comforts me beyond anything I expected.

The mothers.

The mothers, we rock.

We sway.

We bounce.

And we rock.

We hold packets and folders and binders of admissions and program information tightly to our chests, our arms folded securely around the stacks, sure to not lose a single paper or note. We switch from arm to arm, balancing the stack on our hip, swaying, rocking, bouncing while we wait. Sometimes the Wait is longer than expected and we alternate left arm-hip bounce to rightarm-hip sway and back again. And when we've been there a bit and have exchanged glances with the other bouncesway-rockers- and then our children, where we try to hold their look the longest, but they inevitably look away too quickly- always so quickly!- we ALL pull our stacks back to our center, tightly against our chests. Sometimes we settle ourselves in those last minutes of the Wait by absentmindedly rubbing the smooth backs of the stacks, drawing circles with our thumbs, smoothing invisible creases with the lightest fingertip sweeps. We keep the rhythm of our swaying.

We eagerly enter the room once it is unlocked. Our stacks

held securely, mostly angling protectively away from the person holding the door as we pass. We smile, murmur thanks, and hold our stacks close.

I watch as we sit before tables. We gently place our stacks directly in front of us, I'm positive the paper is warm for just this instant, still warm from being held so tightly-some removing papers for notes jotted for later review but then always replaced neatly and gathered lovingly for our walk to our next Wait. I've yet to see a mother leave her stack behind.

At our next Wait we begin the Sway-Bounce-Rock-Glance Dance again.

I recognize this dance and that is what makes me smile.

Every mother that ever was, knows this dance.

I am comforted by the universal love that is a Mother's. It is their children that may become my child's new people.

These mothers hold close their baby's dreams and hopes on University letterhead. Just as I do, again and again.

We mothers dance alone in line at the DMV or the bank, alone in line at the ladies' room at a craft fair, alone in our kitchens heating water for tea, alone in ballot boxes, holding pens and hoping and praying for the coming days and countless intentions that are ours, our babies often mile and miles of earth or heaven away. We never stop the
