Pastor's Word

Greetings in the Name of Christ,

As the crisp temperatures of Fall settle in and the leaves of the trees fall to the ground, our minds begin turn to the upcoming holiday season. Yes, it is November already, and Thanksgiving Day will soon be here. While the holidays are a time for joy and celebration, it is also a time of increased activity and oftentimes a lot of stress. I hope that you will be able to take a few moments in the days and weeks ahead to relax and to ponder the true meaning of the holidays.

Thanksgiving is a state of mind, and while the Thanksgiving holiday is a time when we make a special effort to give thanks to God for all the blessings we have received, it is something we should be doing year round! Also, during Thanksgiving, we should evaluate the reasons for our giving thanks. Fall Session CT Conference UCC Annual Meeting

The Fall session of the One-Hundred Forty-Third Meeting of the Connecticut Conference of the United Church of Christ was held October 22-23, 2010 at Middletown High School, Middletown, Connecticut.

The theme of the weekend event was "Journey with Jesus...400 Years of Transforming Mission." It commemorated the 200th anniversary of our nation's first overseas mission society, whose heritage lives on today in the UCC's Wider Church Ministries.

The international mission society was founded on September 5, 1810 by five men meeting in Farmington, Connecticut. Now we look forward to the next 200 years of mission and ministry.

The keynote speaker was Dr. Robert Orr, the Assistant Secretary-General for Strategic Planning and Policy Coordination at the United Nations. He has published extensively on post-conflict reconstruction, peacekeeping and democracy promotion.

A number of workshops were offered. All were designed for 3 main categories of interest – Global Ministries, Local Ministry & Outreach and Evangelism.

Bryan Nurnberg, president and founder of **Simply Smiles**, **Inc.** was honored with the Living Waters Award, which recognizes outstanding Christian life and witness that is done outside the church setting as an expression of one's faith.

Rev. Charles L. Wildman marked his first appearance as Interim Conference Minister before the assembly. His service to the Conference began on August 15.

The Special Commission on Conference Sustainability, which has been examining the means by which the Conference funds its ministries reported to the assembled delegates. It has conducted wide-ranging interviews and research on the commitments and possibilities.

Worship was under the guidance of Conference Preacher the Rev. John Nelson, pastor of the Niantic Community Church.
