Word from the Pastor

Greetings in the name of Christ!

Our Sunday worship services are a very visible and important part of our Church family. It is a time when we reconnect with God and with each other. It is our opportunity to be together to pray, praise God, share our joys and concerns, and to recharge ourselves as we begin another week. Undoubtedly, Sunday worship is central to the life of our Church family. However, what grows from our worshiping together also central to our faith.

When we leave the time of worship, we then go forth and minister to the world. Strangely enough, our ministries sometimes counterintuitive. For example, over the last five or so years, we have worked together with Robert Adkins. After hearing about Bob's life, faith journey and call to Ministry, an Ordination Council unanimously recommended that First Church proceed with the ordination of Bob to the Christian Ministry.

We thank God for the opportunity to have shared and to have worked with Bob. But the irony of it all is that after his ordination, Bob will leave our midst. The bottom line is that our time together was to prepare him to leave us and share God's love with others.

The same is true of our programs for children and youth. Everything from our Sunday School classes to the many activities offered and the trips to distant places like Los Angeles, Puerto Rico, and Montreal are intended to prepare our children and youth for the future. More often than not, they move on to new places.

After having an important place in the life of our Church, many adults have moved to different parts of the country. We cannot place chains around their legs and prevent them from moving. Rather, we hope and pray that they will worship and minister in their new communities.

We don't just do ministry to keep our members and friends to ourselves. God also calls us to minister to those outside our Church. So we don't support First Church financially so that only First Church benefits. A high percentage of our resources are dedicated to ministering to people outside of our Church. Our building is used by community groups and we support national and international ministries through the United Church of Christ and the American Baptist Churches. We directly support many other organizations that minister to those in need.

So as we begin our annual stewardship campaign, I hope you'll remember that your support impacts far more people that you might think. We are sharing God's love both here and around the world.

Bells of Hope is one of Connecticut's statewide National Adoption Month initiatives. It is a weekend where faith communities partner with the Child Welfare System by raising their voices in prayer and ringing bells, when available, for all the Connecticut children waiting for permanent homes. We will participate by ringing our Church bell at 6p.m.

Our bell will ring one time for each Connecticut child in need of a permanent home. Last year that number was 28. We will know this year's number a few days before the events. In the past three years this event has grown to include over 160 faith communities throughout the state. Your participation is truly appreciated.

Why should we support this effort? Nationally, there are over 104,000 children in the foster care system awaiting a family. Some of these children will never be adopted and will "age out". Of those who age out, approximately 50 percent of them eventually experience homelessness or become incarcerated. Most will never finish high school and many of the girls will end up becoming single mothers, repeating the cycle of poverty, abuse and addiction that brought them into care.



Service of Ordination November 30th

Last month, an Ordination Council of the Hartford Association of American Baptist Churches met and unanimously voted to recommend that First Church of Winsted proceed with the ordination of Robert Adkins.

A Service of Ordination is a very special (and not very common) celebration in the life of a church. It is the culmination of a very comprehensive process.

In the Baptist and Congregational tradition, a local church works closely with someone who feels called to serve in the Christian Ministry. When the local church discerns that the candidate is called by the Holy Spirit and possesses the gifts to be a Minister, the congregation licenses the candidate to preach (which we did over a year ago). When the candidate has met all the training requirements for Ministry (a Master of Divinity degree, Clinical Pastoral Education at a local hospital, etc.), the local church, jointly with the Commission on the Ministry of our State organization (in Bob's case, the American Baptist Churches of Connecticut), reports to sister churches of the Area Association that we feel that Bob is called to be an ordained Minister. The sister churches then meet and examine Bob. This was the Ordination Council that took place last month.

With the unanimous support of our sister American Baptist Churches of the Hartford Association, we are now ready to have the actual service of ordination. Following Biblical tradition, one part of the Ordination Service is the laying on hands of the ordained ministers Representatives of the American Baptist Churches of Connecticut, the Hartford Association, members of Bob's family, and the members of our congregation will join in this service which is a public demonstration of our confidence that God has called Bob to be a Minister of the Gospel. At the Service of Ordination, we also send Bob forth into the world to do God's work as a professional church leader.

We hope that you all will be able to attend this very special and important service!
