Word from the Pastor

Greetings in the name of Christ!

As the leaves change color and the evenings get cooler with each passing day, I find our side yard and basement in a state of chaos. Our 1,000 gallon in-ground oil tank was taken out today. And if you know how much stock I put into a nice lawn, you can imagine how I feel about the heavy equipment tearing up the yard. But no matter how I feel about it, the tank was in the ground for 25 years, and it had to be removed. And while that was being done, it seemed best to also replace the 25 year old heating and air conditioning system.

What's happening at our home is not much different from the rest of lives. Although we get accustomed to what we have, nothing lasts forever. Sooner or later, things wear out and have to be replaced or changed. If they don't wear out, technology changes and what we have is no longer compatible and become obsolete. Or like the seasons, Summer gives way to Fall, which then leads to Winter. But the good news is that God is with us no matter what the season we are in and no matter what is going on in our lives.

We sometimes overlook God's presence, as it usually takes the form of other people who help us through things. As you know, my timing is always off. Without thinking about the need to remove the tank, I had it filled in the Spring. Fine, it was because I had a fixed price contract, and I wanted every gallon I could get at the lower price... So when we began preparing to remove the tank, I found that I had nearly 800 gallons in it. I looked for companies who would take the oil, thinking that I would be generous and not make them pay me anything for the "black gold." Instead, what I learned was that I had to PAY them to take the oil. Just another dumb move on my part.

But God's grace was manifested through someone who could use the oil and had the proper equipment to remove it from the tank. We both were blessed. I didn't have to pay a huge sum of money to have the oil removed, and the other person had a use for it.

So there is no need to fear the inevitable changes that will take place in our lives. God will always be there with us, and more often than not through the many people who share life with us.
