Word from the Pastor

I begin this month's note with some material I found online looking back at the history of the Reformation. I will conclude with my own reflection looking ahead and how God is calling us forward.

Looking Back



This year marks 500 years since Martin Luther, published his 95 theses or complaints against the Catholic Church and launched the Protestant **Reformation**, a religious revolution whose consequences we still live with today.

The Reformation was not about anything new, but about returning to the unchanged and unchanging truth of the Gospel. This is still true for today. The celebration of the 500th anniversary of the Reformation is a time to return: to the truth, to the basics, to the foundation of our faith in Jesus Christ.

On October 31, 1517 Martin Luther published 95 criticisms of the Catholic Church practice of selling Indulgences. An **indulgence** was a payment to the Catholic Church that purchased an exemption from punishment. It was penance for some types of sins. Although he intended to reform Catholicism, not break it apart, he accomplished both. On the 500th anniversary of his act of conscientious defiance, it is important to review how that moment changed the world religiously, economically, politically, socially, and intellectually. The upheaval stretched into every fabric of society, exceeding anything Martin Luther could anticipate.

Although the Reformation of Christianity began a half-millennium ago, it has not completed its destiny. When it began the movement was caused by the abuses of the Roman Catholic hierarchy. Reformers shared a common experience that included a conviction that Catholicism was different from New Testament Christianity and failed to either practice or preach Christ's Gospel.

Called Forward

This year as we celebrate the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, I find myself looking around at the contemporary church through the lens of the Reformation. I have been surprised to find it encouraging, convicting, informing, and inspiring me.

As the writer of the first part of this note reminds us, Martin Luther wasn't looking to make something new but to reform something old. He loved the church, and just wanted to reform it. He loved doctrine (especially justification by faith alone) and wanted it recovered. I have to admit that as


Angels Among Us #DONOTBEAFRAID


October's Worship THEME JOURNEY TO GENEROSITY.

WE continue our fall theme of TRAVELING TOGETHER ON THE JOURNEY.

This month we shift our focus to the concept of **GENEROSITY.**

When we follow the way of Jesus, we follow a path that leads to a generous way of life that derives from the generosity of God. While some people pop into Christian faith as fully-mature stewards, most of us follow a journey in which our generosity grows as we become ever more aware of the generosity of God and of how to respond adequately.

October 29: Matthew 22:34-46: **THE GREAT COMMANDMENT.** The perfect text for the climax to a look at generosity: loving God includes loving neighbor, which can have material dimensions.




