Word from the Pastor

Greeting to you all,

Life is complicated. Or at least I think the simplest things in my life require complex analysis.

With each passing morning, it is darker and darker when my alarm goes off. My brain makes a note that autumn is here and that I need to wear a light jacket outside. Yet as I am getting into the car, my brain hesitates (more than the usual) and tells me that I will be too warm in the car unless I open the windows or take off the jacket. So now my poor little brain has to decide whether I'd rather listen to the radio or enjoy the nice fresh air. A memory scan points out that last fall and winter the radio in that car would not work when the temperature dropped below 45 degrees. So my brain decides I better to listen to the radio while I know it will work as opposed to trusting BMW to have truly fixed the computer glitch in the radio's microchip. As I shed my coat I wonder if I should drive the Chevy to work. It doesn't look as classy, but the radio plays whenever I push the button. 
