Greetings in the name of Christ!

One of things that makes First Church special is that we are very focused on mission and helping others. A few months ago we learned that the wall along the back side of Casa Hogar was falling down. Evidently some not-very friendly neighbors raised the level of the road by about 3 feet. The existing wall was not made to support pressure....it's sole purpose was to keep people and animals out of the premises (or at least make them use the entrance on the front side). The wall was collapsing under the new weight, and there was concern that the wall would fall and potentially injure someone

Casa Hogar did not have the funds (about US\$4,500) to replace the wall with one that would withstand the pressure of the road against it. We accepted the challenge and agreed to replace the part of the wall that would bear the weight of the soil. We then put out a call for help to our congregation. In a short time, we raised the full amount needed, and the project is now complete! Here is a photo of the collapsing wall, the wall being torn down, and the new wall (which isn't so much of a wall as it is a foundation).

Thanks to all who helped make the replacement of the wall possible!





Recipe of the Month... September!



Fried Cinnamon Apple Rings for the apple rings 4 large apples (I used gala)

1 cup flour

1/4 teaspoon baking powder

2 tablespoons sugar

1/4 teaspoon salt

for the cinnamon sugar topping

1/₃ cup sugar

2 teaspoons cinnamon

1/4 teaspoon cinnamon

1 large egg, beaten

1 cup buttermilk vegetable oil for frying

Instructions

In a large bowl combine the flour, baking powder, sugar, salt and 1/8 teaspoon cinnamon. Set aside. In a small bowl combine the egg and buttermilk. In a third dish, make your cinnamon-sugar topping by combining the ½ cup sugar and 2 teaspoons cinnamon. Set that aside too. Next, slice the apples into 1/4-inch thick slices, and use circle biscuit cutters in graduated sizes to make rings out of each slice. Discard the center circles containing the apple core. Heat the oil in a frying pan over medium heat to 350°F. Combine the contents of the first and second dishes as the oil warms up. This will be your batter. Dip the apple rings in and out of the batter one at a time, removing any dripping excess by tapping the rings against the side of the bowl. Fry the rings in small batches, turning them to ensure browning on both sides. Once the rings are golden and crispy, transfer them to a plate lined with paper towel for a few seconds. Quickly transfer the apple rings, one by one, into the cinnamon-sugar mixture and coat evenly. Transfer to a wire rack and serve warm.
