Greetings!

It is a purposeful activity as we gear up for the start of our fall activities here at First Church. Meghan Kane will be returning to Fordham University as a sophomore, majoring in communications, minoring in business administration.


Courtney Kane will be attending Fordham Law School for her third and final year...




There is a saying, "He who sings once, pravs twice."


