

Paul sums up this way of life in 1st Timothy 1:5 as one of love, which comes from a pure heart, a good conscience and a sincere faith! Bring a cup of coffee or tea and join as as we think about ways that the teachings of Paul apply to our own church and our own lives!

2016 Mexico Mission

Continuing a First Church of Winsted tradition that has been on-going for over a decade, a team of volunteers traveled to Mexico in July to work in two very distinct locations. The team consisted of people from age 14 through "too old to admit our age." Some were previous Mission Trip participants, and others experienced it for the first time.

In Oaxaca, we had a short but meaningful visit to Casa Hogar. We had the opportunity to see many who we've known since they were children. Nacho, the blind boy who first dazzled us with his ability to ride a bicycle through the complex without hitting anyone or anything, is completing his second year of law school. Angel, another blind boy who was dropped off at Casa Hogar by his mother during one of our first mission trips to Casa Hogar, has learned to be very independent and easily navigates his way around Casa Hogar without the need of assistance. Betsy, who with her twin brother, was one of the most affectionate children of Casa Hogar in years past, is now a young lady who is a bit shy and coy. Many of the adults, including Anna and Vicky (both wheelchair bound) were in good spirits although a bit worn because everyone is helping to care for Carol Marin, the director of Casa Hogar, who was hospitalized.

From Oaxaca, we journeyed across Mexico to the Yucatan peninsula to the city of Merida to work at a school for children with multiple disabilities. The weather was totally different from Oaxaca. Every day, the temperature soared above 100 degrees and the humidity was always above 80%. The team was incredibly adaptable. The facility did not have a single air conditioner, so we worked in the morning until the hottest part of the day, rested for a few hours, and then worked in the evening from 5pm until 9:30 or 10:00pm. Solvluna, the school, had just recently moved to this new facility, and did not have the funds to do any improvements to the building. The team did a makeover of the interior and exterior of the building. We painted the entire exterior, including the wall between the sidewalk and the building. We replaced the screens in the windows, scrapped and repainted many interior walls damaged

because of the high humidity, installed new lighting, and even installed a Smart Board that sat in a closet since the move because of a lack of funds to pay someone to mount it to the wall. The grass in the front and back of the building was knee high, so we contracted with a passerby with a machete to cut it down. The team bagged the cut grass and cleaned up the front yard for an upcoming graduation ceremony and the backyard so the students and their families could play. We collected so many large bags of trash that the trash collectors refused to take them until we negotiated a "supplemental fee" for their removal.

The nine team members accomplished a tremendous amount in a week, but it would not have been possible without the prayers and support of our "silent partners" who generously support the Mission Trip year after year. Thank you for making the Trip possible for over a decade through your time, efforts, and contributions!
